AQUANASTIC classes will be offered at KOA, Thursday's and Tuesday's November 1 to 20. There are 6 sessions from 10 to 11 AM. This water fitness class is energizing and strengthening, yet gentle on the joints. The exercises are designed to increase range of motion, flexibility and cardiovascular fitness.

Swimming ability is not required. The classes are conducted in a 3-to-5 feet deep heated 'salt water' pool at KOA located at 1100 Ridge Road in Hammond. This camp ground provides hot showers with shampoo and shower gels, restrooms and a hot tub. Students are requested to arrive with swim suits on and bring their own towels. Parking car tags need to be picked up at the main office at KOA. Students need to sign in before each class at the main office.

Only 12 students can attend. Please make a reservation with Kathleen Hudson at 503 861-2802. There is no charge for the use of the pool. Students are expected to provide their own 'noodle' for the class, water shoes are also recommend.

These classes will be led by Kathleen Hudson, a water exercise professional with certifications from American Red Cross and Arthritis Aquatic Training.

BOOK DISCUSSION: *The Putin Interviews*

This fall Steve Berk will be introducing us to "The Putin Interviews" with Oliver Stone, through a book of the transcripts and as a documentary film. Being a major player in international politics, both before and after Donald Trump's rise to power, Vladimir Putin has remained one of the world's most controversial figures. In that regard, Oliver Stone, writer and filmmaker, states, "...at least we should try to understand him." If you have an interest in doing just that, this seven-week class is for you. Filmed in four parts in 2017, Stone's objective and personable approach reveals perhaps a more accurate picture of the Russian leader than can be obtained through media simplification. Putin emerges as a gifted, pragmatic leader, interested in engaging the West, and addressing difficult world issues. You be the judge as to motives and possible outcomes. This promises to be a class offering intense discussion and reassessment of our own political views.
