Title: Dr. Scott Borg on U.S. Scientific Programs at the Antarctic

Dr. Scott Borg, Section Head, Antarctic Infrastructure & Logistics, Division of Polar Programs, and Geosciences, Directorate of the National Science Foundation. (PhD in Geology, Arizona State University.)

May 5, 2014. **Scott Borg** of NSF's Division of Polar Programs has been named by the nonprofit Partnership for Public Service as one of 33 **Samuel J. Heyman Presidential Awards**.

Citation: Dr. Borg has helped turn the U.S. Antarctic science program into the largest and most prestigious research effort on the continent. Specifically: the National Science Foundation's Antarctic research program has become one of the most esteemed and comprehensive on the continent. Today, Dr. Borg plays a critical role in guiding the U.S. Antarctic science program that supports cutting-edge research across a range of topics, including climate change, the origins and nature of the universe, the discovery of new species of extinct dinosaurs, and collecting a 15-million-year-old water sample trapped half a mile below the surface of Antarctica.
